198 Patient and Public Panel (PPP) members are now involved in the work of the trust. Thank you all for your support!

PPP work plan update.

We would like to thank you for your brilliant contributions at our PPP work plan development sessions that took place across the past month.

Your feedback will help us to co-produce the work plan for the third year and we thought it would be good to share the key themes that we have identified before the work plan is shared with you as a draft format.

Involvement opportunities: We had some great feedback around involvement, and you told us that you feel you have had the opportunity to get involved in opportunities we have shared. It was great to hear that you are also happy to increase this number heading into the panel's third year. Where some of you haven't been involved as much as you would have liked, you told us this was due to a preference around engaging virtually and COVID pressures with work etc.

Information sharing: In the sessions we found mixed responses, most enjoyed the information we shared and this encouraged us to keep this up, however a suggestion was made to send out a weekly roundup email with key information and upcoming opportunities to reduce email traffic - watch this space!

Support and development: We found from feedback that you are happy with the development opportunities to date, and welcome more of these opportunities going forward whilst we are working virtually. We are aware several you wish to visit our trust sites to have an opportunity to speak to operational staff in various roles. We would like to arrange this once it is safe to do so.

Increasing our representation: In the work plan sessions, we also discussed the PPPs current representation which identified a couple of gaps that we need to make improvements on.

You said that you would be happy to help support us to increase these numbers and would share messages on how to get involved via community groups and social media hubs about the panel to encourage uptake in different communities.

All comments and feedback from the sessions are now being collated, themed, and fed into the draft work plan which we would like to share with you before we make this live. This will be shared with you as we head into the new year.

New greener ambulances join

our fleet this winter.

Fifty-five new emergency ambulances will take to the North West's roads before the end of January 2022, replacing older vehicles in our fleet.

The emergency vehicles are greener and more efficient than their predecessors. Built to Euro 6 standards, they produce fewer harmful pollutants, particularly nitrogen oxides, carbon monoxide, hydrocarbons, and particulate matter.

Converted from Fiat Ducato vans - the most reliable and fuel-efficient vehicle in its class – the new ambulances are replacements for existing vehicles over seven years old. But we're keeping hold of 45 of the best ones until the end of winter to help maximise our fleet at the busiest time of year, thanks to a funding boost we have received to help with winter pressures.



Stations in Greater Manchester will get 29 new ambulances and 17 retained, Cumbria and Lancashire will get 24 new and 13 retained, and Cheshire and Merseyside will get two new vehicles and retain 15 existing ambulances.

It takes approximately 400 hours to convert a standard Fiat Ducato van into a high-specification emergency ambulance. This involves installing electricity, creating windows in the side panels, fitting the blue lights and sirens, and applying livery to make them instantly recognisable as ambulances. NWAS Voices

We've launched a one stop shop, useful 999 information booklet which contains key information about accessing the ambulance service via 999.

It includes details on the types of calls we class as needing a priority response, the different ways we manage 999 calls, what alternatives to calling 999 there are, and the importance of letting us know when an ambulance is no longer required.

We are conscious that many of our public messages are managed via our social media platforms and through engagement with our community groups and are aware that these messages may not reach those people who don't access social media on a regular basis, if at all.

We will be distributing hard copies of the booklet to local Healthwatch organisations and a downloadable version you can print is also available.


